2010 was a very exciting year from day one. On January 1, four TASF Board members and a Board advisor were honored alongside eleven other Documented Original Tuskegee Airmen (DOTA) at the Pasadena Tournament of Roses® Parade. The Float entitled, "Tuskegee Airmen - A Cut Above" won the Mayor's Award - Most Outstanding Float submitted by a city. What a way to start the year! And it just kept getting better...

In April our first SMSgt Levarn Adger Air Force JROTC Scholarship was presented to Cadet CMSgt Jeffery King, Jr. Jeffery is a senior top performer academically and the highest ranking cadet in the cadet corps. SMSgt Adger is the Aerospace Science Instructor (ASI) at CAJ. This scholarship is unique to the CAJ AFJROTC unit because of the extensive service done by CAJ cadets to administer the TAI AFJROTC award program for the other 890 AFJROTC units and over 104,000 cadets around the world.

TASF partnered with University of Phoenix for a second year, and in May, five full-tuition four year scholarships were awarded to students to complete an undergraduate degree on-line or at a University of Phoenix campus. The scholarships will cover tuition and fees (including University of Phoenix on-line textbooks).

TAI Chapters continue to submit competitive scholarship nominations. We received 82 qualified applications and TASF presented forty \$1,500 scholarships to an outstanding class of scholarship recipients in June.

In addition, we had another successful year with the Combined Federal Campaign, and received a significant contribution from George Lucas, a memorial to former Board member, Oliver Goodall. Sadly, two TASF Board Members joined the Lonely Eagles this year; William Holloman in June and Oliver Goodall in November. We miss them terribly and will always appreciate what they have done for TASF.

We would like to thank **all** of our contributors for their donations. Without you these scholarships would not be possible. We hope that you will continue to contribute whatever you can so that we can continue to preserve the legacy of the Tuskegee Airmen by providing scholarships to deserving students.

The TASF Mission

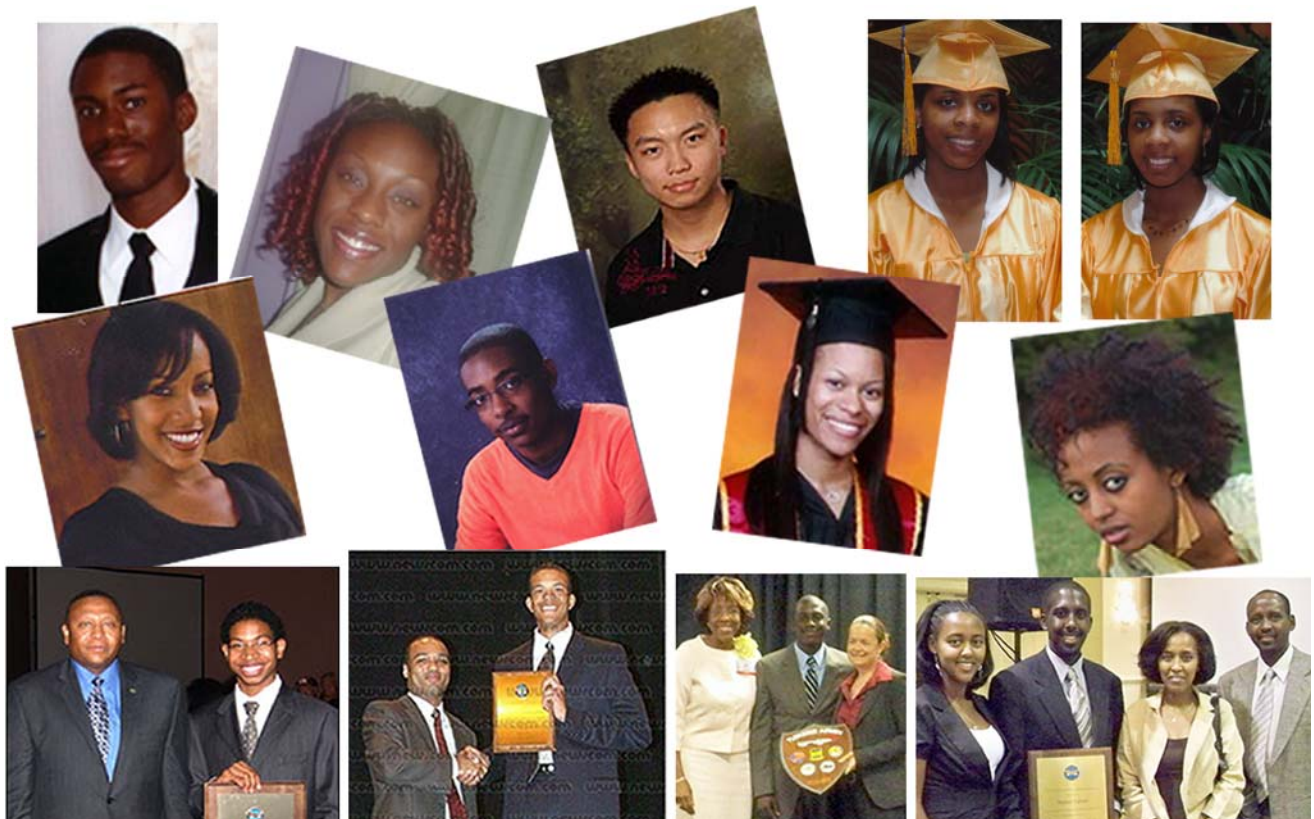
To provide educational and charitable services for the purpose of honoring living and deceased members of the Tuskegee Airmen and other persons who have made significant contributions in the field of aviation, aerospace and science technology.

TASF provides scholarships to assist financially disadvantaged and deserving young men and women in the pursuit of their educational goals.

TASF provides scholarship assistance awards to graduating high school seniors preparing to enter college and deserving of such recognition.

In 1979, the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation was established with an initial goal of \$1 million dollars. Seed money came from pledges, contributions and the proceeds of a Memorial Banquet honoring General Daniel "Chappie" James, Jr. The goal was achieved in 1997 and in 2007 the fund balance reached \$2,000,000.00.

In the little more than three decades of annual award presentations, TASF has assisted over 1,100 students by virtue of these scholarship awards, to make the transition from high school to college, many of whom would not have been otherwise able to do so.

This Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation scholarship named in honor of SMSgt Levarn Adger (Ret), was presented on Friday 30 April at the C A Johnson HS AFJROTC 39th Annual Awards Dining Out. SMSgt Adger is the Aerospace Science Instructor (ASI) at CAJ. The award was presented to Cadet CMSgt Jeffery King, Jr. Jeffery was a senior top performer academically and the highest ranking cadet in the cadet corps. He is attending South Carolina State College in Orangeburg, SC. The \$500 award is paid to his college account. This scholarship is unique to the CAJ AFJROTC unit because of the extensive service done by CAJ cadets to administer the TAI AFJROTC award program for the other 890 AFJROTC units and over 104,000 cadets around the world.

TASF partnered with University of Phoenix for the second year to offer the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation/University of Phoenix Scholarship Program

The purpose of the scholarship program is to provide educational opportunities to disadvantaged students in pursuit of their academic studies.

Five full-tuition scholarships were awarded to students to complete an undergraduate degree online or at a University of Phoenix campus (renewable up to four years). The scholarships will cover tuition and fees (including University of Phoenix online textbooks). The scholarship award is a non-cash credit to the recipient's University of Phoenix account. These scholarships are directed toward students who graduated from high school since 2007 and may be used for an undergraduate degree program of the student's choice.

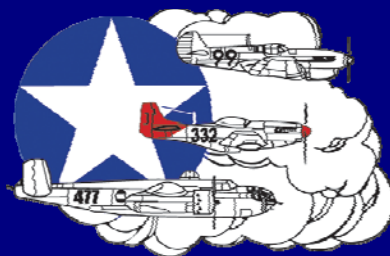
