Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation (TASF) Choose Colorado Teen as Pratt & Whitney Golden Eagle Scholarship Recipient

Los Angeles, California – July 29, 2008. The Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation (TASF) has chosen Mahad M. Fahieh of Aurora, Colorado as the recipient of the Golden Eagle Scholarship Award. He was presented with his award during the Youth Luncheon at the Tuskegee Airmen Annual Convention in Philadelphia Pennsylvania on July 19, 2008.

The four year \$20,000 award recognizes a high school senior who has demonstrated an aptitude for aerospace technology and aviation. Pratt & Whitney, a world leader in the aerospace industry, will fully fund the scholarship. The Golden Eagle Scholarship is the largest single endowment of the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation. Each year,

TASF presents \$1,500 scholarship awards to 41 students and one Pratt & Whitney scholarship award of \$20,000 to a deserving student who instills the ideals, leadership and commitment as exemplified by the Tuskegee Airmen.

Mahad has achieved academically (3.9 GPA) and shown his leadership skills with over 350 volunteer hours of community and youth activities. Mahad is a graduate of Smokey Hill High School in Aurora, Colorado. He is a member of the National Honor Society and will attend the University of Colorado at Boulder, majoring in Aerospace Engineering. Mahad future plans are to become an Air Force Fighter Pilot and eventually an Astronaut. His many activities include being a member of the Denver Museum Leadership Council and Vice President of the Denver Museum Air and Space Sciences Club. He is a Tutor of the Brotherhood, helping other students improve their grades. In Young Frontiers, he has mentored middle school students about high school and their futures.
